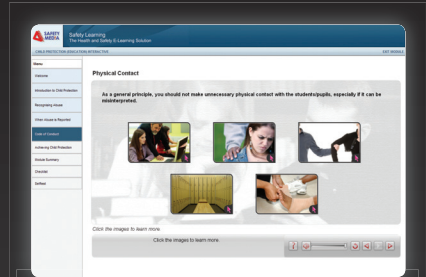


# Child Protection
